2019 CDIL Summer Symposium Fellowship Program

Faculty Fellowship - Call for Applications

Description: The CDIL Summer Symposium Fellowship program supports College of Letters, Arts and Social Science (CLASS) faculty as they begin or continue expanding their work with digital scholarship tools, projects, and processes. The award will provide \$1500 of summer salary to participate with a cohort of fellow awardees from both the University of Idaho and Washington State University's Center for Digital Scholarship and Curation (CDSC) in the 2nd annual Palouse Digital Scholarship Symposium.

The week-long symposium will explore a broad variety of tools, techniques, and ideas informing the digital scholarship field. The symposium will be hosted alternately by both institutions, beginning on May 10 with introductions/setup and continuing the following week, May 13 to May 17, with workshops and discussions regarding digital scholarship technology and applications. Librarians and faculty connected with the CDIL and CDSC will direct the program and provide instruction.

Funding and support for these fellowships are provided by the Office of Research and Economic Development (ORED), CLASS, and the UI Library.

Who is eligible: CLASS tenured or tenure-track faculty.

Deadline to apply: March 15, 2019

Number of awards: 2

Amount and source of funds: Each Fellow will receive \$1500 as partial summer salary for participating in the symposium.

Duration of program: The symposium will begin on Friday, May 10 with introductions and setup, and continue the next week, from Monday, May 13 to Friday, May 17, 2019.

Application and review process: Applicants provide a statement of interest (300 words) and background (150 words) via an online form. Applications will be reviewed by a committee of staff and faculty connected to the CDIL.
