## 2019 COGS/CDIL Graduate Student Summer Fellowship Program

**Description:** The CDIL Graduate Student Summer Fellowship Program provides funding for a student currently enrolled in a College of Letters, Arts and Social Sciences Graduate program to work on the development of CDIL-related digital projects, be they projects related to CDIL connected faculty or that of the graduate student's own creation.

The Fellow will also participate in the 2nd annual Palouse Digital Scholarship Symposium, which brings together faculty and graduate students from both the CDIL and WSU's Center for Digital Scholarship and Curation (CDSC) for a week of workshops and discussion.

Funding for this fellowship is provided by the College of Graduate Studies (COGS) and the Office of Research and Economic Development (ORED).

**Expectations:** Fellows will attend the summer symposium starting on May 10, and continuing during the week of May 13 – May 17, after which they will be expected to work at the CDIL for approximately 20-25 hrs per week for 10 weeks.

During the fall semester, Graduate Fellows will present on their work in the CDIL, either as a traditional presentation or as a workshop.

**Who is eligible:** Any student currently enrolled in a CLASS-related graduate program (regardless of graduation date).

**Deadline to apply:** March 8, 2019

**Number of awards:** 1

**Nature of the award:** Summer funding to work in the CDIL during the summer for ~25 hours per week at a rate of \$16/hr.

**Duration of program:** Summer 2019

**Application and review process:** Applicants provide a statement of interest (300 words) and background (150 words) via an online form. Applications will be reviewed by a committee of staff and faculty connected to the CDIL. Finalists may be asked to interview and/or to provide additional references.
