Center for Digital Inquiry and Learning (CDIL) COGS/CDIL Graduate Student Summer Research Fellowship

<u>Description</u>: The CDIL Graduate Student Summer Fellowship Program provides funding for a student currently enrolled in a College of Letters, Arts and Social Sciences Graduate program to work on the development of CDIL related digital projects, be they projects related to CDIL-connected faculty or that of the graduate student's own creation.

The Fellow will also participate in the inaugural Palouse Digital Scholarship Symposium, which brings together faculty and graduate students from both the CDIL and WSU's Center for Digital Scholarship and Curation (CDSC) for a week of workshops and discussion.

Funding for this fellowship is provided by the College of Graduate Studies (COGS) and the Office of Research and Economic Development (ORED).

<u>Expectations</u>: Fellows will attend the summer symposium starting on May 11, and continuing during the week of May 14 – May 18, after which they will be expected to work at the CDIL for approximately 20-25 hrs per week for 10 weeks.

During the fall semester, Graduate Fellows will present on their work in the CDIL, either as a traditional presentation or as a workshop.

Who is eligible: Any student currently enrolled in a CLASS-related graduate program (regardless of graduation date).

<u>Deadline to apply</u>: March 9, 2018

Number of awards: 1

Nature of the award: Summer funding to work in the CDIL during the summer for ~25 hours per week at a rate of \$16/hr.

<u>Duration of program</u>: Summer 2018

<u>Review process</u>: Applications will be reviewed by a committee of staff and faculty connected to the CDIL. Finalists may be asked to interview and/or to provide additional references.
